A planting scheme for Kensington High Street

London's Greenest High Street?

Opportunity Kensington wants Kensington High Street to become one of London's greenest streets. Planting creates shade and aesthetic appeal, encouraging customers to stay longer. It also helps the street deal with the effects of climate change – by countering the urban heat island effect and reducing local flood risk.

The new planting scheme is the first outcome of Opportunity Kensington's Green Infrastructure Strategy. The aim is to create stepping stones between larger, valuable habitat types and lay the foundations for more ambitious projects in coming years – notably rain gardens and increased street trees. The scheme is also strikingly beautiful with high-quality planters and an attractive array of flowering perennials, evergreen shrubs and small trees.

Good quality Green Infrastructure has an important role to play in our urban environments for improving health and wellbeing, air quality, nature recovery and resilience to and mitigation of climate change, along with addressing issues of social inequality and environmental decline". Our Pilot Sites

In May 2024 we created three pilot planting sites on Kensington High Street – outside St Mary Abbots church, Holland Park entrance and corner of Wrights Lane. Planters flank the existing solid Woodscape teak benches. Our planters are Urbis Globe in glass-reinforced concrete with a naturally patinated iron oxide finish. They are manufactured in the UK for a lower carbon footprint. Planting design is by Sarah Shirley of Studio Linton Shirley. The planters are maintained by Opportunity Kensington's Urban Gardener, Mandy Lee.

Completing the scheme – local business support

Our vision for Kensington High Street includes eight more sites, featuring 20 new planters and five new benches. We aim to have these installed in Spring 2025. Opportunity Kensington has earmarked funds to cover 25% of the capital costs. It is seeking partners – landowners, community/residents' organisations and businesses – to cover the remaining 75%.

- Complimentary plant and planter maintenance by Opportunity Kensington in partnership with the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea (RBKC), including litter picking, plant care, watering and damage repair


